A large, imposing castle sits majestically on an island, seemingly standing guard on the Hudson River and all who pass by. Why? Who built it? What was it used for? And what has become of it? Learn why the site was chosen, about its years as a working arsenal, why it was



eventually shut down and sold to the State of New York, about the great fire in 1969, and the eventual creation of the Bannerman Castle Trust - and the future of this amazing site.
